It's hard for me to put into words just how personally grateful I am that SCCCC was selected to be Sheffield Chamber of Commerce's Charity of the Year 2018/2019.

Working with the Chamber's staff over the past year on many diverse events has been an absolute joy and privilege. We have been able to raise our profile tremendously and have had a lot of fun along the way.



The funds raised as a direct result of working with the Chamber are almost £17,000 - to put that in perspective, that is more than 17 days of operational costs which have been fully covered. 17 days of helping lonely and vulnerable older adults in the Sheffield area.

STAFF PROFILE...

Nasima Akther

Good Neighbour Scheme Co-ordinator (BAME)

What does your role involve?

Networking, promoting and raising awareness about how loneliness and social isolation is impacting people over 65 in the BAME communities. To recruit volunteers who have different language skills to support these people.

What does a typical day involve?

No two days are the same. A typical work day involves liaising with other charities who work with the over 65's in Sheffield, meeting with potential volunteers and taking referrals for our Good Neighbour friendly visiting scheme.

What is the best aspect of your job?

Giving someone the most precious gift of friendship and our volunteers' precious time which makes a huge difference in both people lives.

And the worst?

Trying to make people understand that loneliness can affect anyone, any age, anytime. It's not something to feel ashamed about. There is a myth out there that "BAME communities mostly live in a joint family; they look after each other, there is no loneliness or social isolation", but there is. Sheffield is a multi-cultural city, Arabic is the 2nd native spoken language but we are yet to find any volunteers with those language skills.

Inclusion Community Care project launched, thanks to National Lottery community funding

Our Good Neighbours friendly visiting scheme has been running for over 53 years, supporting older people in Sheffield who are isolated or lonely. Volunteers are recruited to visit an older person in their community for a cuppa and a chat.

There are over 100 volunteers helping to combat loneliness in our communities.

Sheffield has become a culturally diverse city with many different communities. Lottery funding has allowed us to recruit our first BAME (Black Asian and Minority Ethnic) Good Neighbour Coordinator, Nasima Akther who will run the two-year project.

The Inclusive Community Care project will engage with and support individuals, aged 65+ from BAME communities, providing weekly visits and linking individuals into the wider community programmes and support available to them.

Nasima said; "This project allows us to be more focused and culturally sensitive to BAME communities across Sheffield, helping us to recruit volunteers and service users with particular focus on specific communities including; Somali, Chinese, Afro Caribbean and Roma."
